A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

*You, my flock, I judge between sheep and sheep.*

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and

the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

*He will take his seat on his throne of glory, and he will separate men one from another.*

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'



## Christ the King: Year A



Dear Friends,  
Feast of Christ the King of All Creation.

The cow burps, the cat purrs, the sparrow flies in, the lamb sniffing moves closer while the donkey, who carried Mary, nibbles the straw of the manger.

The exhausted baby, post birth, sleeps peacefully. His parents gaze on. Time stands still. The King of All Creation, who we profess in the Creed sits at the right hand of the Father, lays at rest born into his own Creation. He is the first born of all creation, splendour of the Father, the Word made flesh Francis of Assisi promoted this way of thinking of Jesus at his birth as the highpoint of why there is creation at all. The point is that God and his creation are at one. God saw what he had made and it was very good is what we read in the beginning of the Bible. This is why we often feel harmonious with God and our neighbour when we are in a beautiful environment. Francis our Pope writes in *Laudato Si*; Jesus lived in full harmony with creation, and others were amazed: 'What sort of man is this that even the seas and the winds obey him (98).

The logical extension is that if Jesus is in full harmony with creation, we the disciples live in full harmony with creation also. But this is not so easy for many because it may challenge to revalue God's creation and our role in the poor state of our seas, rivers and forests. The message from environmental science is that humankind has not cared for the earth very well. Yet we believe that Jesus Christ is the King of All Creation. The challenge is for our belief to inform the way we treat and use the earth that has been gifted to us.
