Dear Parishioners

Most major companies, such as airlines, have 'club' or 'loyalty' or 'frequent flyer' points. Members of the club get brochures online with many gadgets and products that one can exchange for points earned by being loyal. I know, when at the supermarket, if I go to a 'check out' person with my trolley they will ask me if I am a member of such a scheme. I sometimes think that some people imagine belief in God is such a scheme. In other words if you are good and loyal to God, you will get rewards and be free of pain and suffering. Perhaps if God was a firm, if you got pain and suffering instead of gadgets and products, you could ask for your money back or maybe take God to the Small Claims Tribunal!

Last week in the Gospel, Peter named Jesus as "The Christ" and was praised and promoted by Jesus. Then Jesus continues the Gospel by saying... now I am going to Jerusalem to suffer, be rejected, to die and to rise again. Peter says... hang on, this is not the scheme I signed up for. This is a bad idea. Perhaps Peter felt he was tricked in to being the leading disciple. Perhaps similar to the complaint the Prophet Jeremiah uttered in the first reading; *you have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced.*

This the twist of the Gospel, if you follow Jesus then you have to face up to the question... *if God loves me, why do I have to suffer and die?* It is a question that arises at every stage of our lives and the answer is different at each turn and rise along life's road. It's a similar question Jesus asked in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Before travel restrictions were imposed, I walked the Camino, a famous pilgrimage to Santiago, Spain. It is a walk of several hundred kilometres, it guarantees pain, blisters, discomfort, exhaustion, thirst, hunger, heat and cold. People, who are not mad, walk for many reasons but a popular reason people give is along the lines of 'finding myself' or 'to make myself vulnerable'. The strange thing about the pain of the journey is that it is an experience that often frees the person. Typically, people begin the journey carrying many problems. Rather like carrying the Cross. But the grace of the walk often relieves the heaviness of personal burdens. People find themselves by losing themselves. At the end of the journey, people feel they have lost something they no longer need and have gained a newness; a freshness for life which they need and welcome. I understand that people happily pay much money for the experience of a painful journey that leads to a resurrection. People do not seem to ask for their money back. I wonder why?

FIRST READING : Jeramiah 20:7-9

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced; you have overpowered me: you were the stronger. I am a daily laughing-stock, everybody's butt. Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!' The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long. I used to say, I will not think about him, I will not speak in his name any more. Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones. The effort to restrain it wearied me, I could not bear it.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Ps 62:2-6. 8-9. R. v.2

Response: My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God.

O God, you are my God, for you I long;
for you my soul is thirsting.
My body pines for you
like a dry, weary land without water. **(R)**

So I gaze on you in the sanctuary
to see your strength and your glory.
For your love is better than life,
my lips will speak your praise. **(R)**

So I will bless you all my life,
in your name I will lift up my hands.

SECOND READING: Romans 12:1-2

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans
Think of God's mercy, my brothers, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your living bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

Alleluia, alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our heart, that we might see how great is the hope to which we are called. **Alleluia!**

GOSPEL: Matthew: 16:21-27

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven

preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

Poi Gesù continua il Vangelo dicendo ... ora vado a Gerusalemme per soffrire, essere rifiutato, morire e risorgere. Pietro dice ... aspetta, questo non è il programma fedeltà a cui mi sono iscritto. Questa è una cattiva idea. Forse Pietro si è sentito ingannato nell'essere scelto come primo discepolo. Forse è simile al lamento che il profeta Geremia pronunciò nella prima lettura; *mi hai sedotto, Signore, e io mi sono lasciato sedurre.*

Questa è la svolta del Vangelo, se segui Gesù devi affrontare la domanda ... *se Dio mi ama, perché devo soffrire e morire?* È una domanda che sorge in ogni fase della nostra vita e la risposta è diversa ad ogni svolta e sorge lungo la strada della vita. È una domanda simile che Gesù fece nel Giardino del Getsemani.

Prima che venissero imposte le restrizioni sui viaggi, ho percorso il famoso *Camino* di pellegrinaggio a Santiago, in Spagna. È una camminata di diverse centinaia di chilometri, provoca dolore, vesciche, disagio, spossatezza, sete, fame, caldo e freddo. Le persone, che non sono pazze, camminano per molte ragioni, ma una delle ragioni principali è sulla falsariga di "trovare me stesso" o "rendermi vulnerabile". La cosa strana del dolore del viaggio è che è un'esperienza che spesso libera la persona.

In genere, le persone iniziano il viaggio portando molti problemi. Un po' come portare la Croce. Ma la grazia della camminata spesso allevia la pesantezza dei fardelli personali. Le persone si ritrovano perdendosi. Alla fine del viaggio, le persone sentono di aver perso qualcosa di cui non hanno più bisogno e hanno acquisito una novità; una freschezza per la vita di cui hanno bisogno e accolgono. Capisco che le persone paghino felicemente molti soldi per l'esperienza di un viaggio doloroso che porta alla risurrezione. Le persone non sembrano chiedere indietro i loro soldi. Mi chiedo perché?

Se qualcuno vuole essere un mio seguace, rinunci a se stesso, prenda la sua croce e mi segua. Chiunque voglia salvare questa vita, la perderà; ma chi perde la vita per causa mia, la troverà.
